ORDER REGARDING CONSENT TO MAGISTRATE JUDGE JURISDICTION IN SOCIAL SECURITY APPEALS

Under <u>28 U.S.C. § 636(c)</u> and this Court's Administrative Orders, United States Magistrate Judges are authorized to exercise jurisdiction and preside over civil cases with the consent of all parties. The United States Attorney for the Middle District of Florida has agreed to a general consent on behalf of the United States to the jurisdiction of United States Magistrate Judges in the Middle District of Florida over social security disability cases, reserving the right to withdraw the consent in any particular case. The United States also reserves the right to withdraw the general consent upon notice, but such withdrawal will apply only to cases filed after the date of the notice. <u>See</u> attached letter, dated July 24, 2023.

In light of the United States' general consent to United States Magistrate Judge jurisdiction over social security disability appeals in the Middle District of Florida, if a plaintiff consents at case opening, and if the United States does not withdraw its consent, the case shall be randomly assigned directly to a United States Magistrate Judge without the necessity of an Order of Reference.

If the plaintiff declines to consent, or if the United States timely withdraws its consent, the Clerk shall randomly assign the case to a United States District Judge. In that event, the case shall be deemed referred, without further order, to the same United States Magistrate Judge for all preliminary proceedings, and for the preparation of a Report and Recommendation.
