

Judge Wendy Berger joined the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida on August 1, 2019, after being appointed by President Donald J. Trump. Prior to her service on the federal district court, Judge Berger served as a District Judge on Florida's Fifth District Court of Appeal (2012-2019), and as a Circuit Judge in Florida's Seventh Judicial Circuit (2005-2012). From 2001-2005, she served as an Assistant General Counsel and Clemency Aide to then Governor Jeb Bush and, from 1993-2000, as an Assistant State Attorney in the Seventh Judicial Circuit.

Judge Berger currently presides over full dockets in both the Jacksonville and Orlando Divisions of the Middle District of Florida. She is also actively involved in her community and the Bar, serving on numerous committees and professional organizations. She is frequently asked to speak and has lectured on a wide variety of topics including professionalism, originalism, textualism, the judicial appointment process, appellate practice, federal practice, extradition, the death penalty, and drug court.

Judge Berger was raised in Jacksonville, Florida. She is a graduate of Stanton College Preparatory School, Florida State University, and The Florida State University College of Law, where she was a member of Law Review.

Judge Berger and her husband, Larry, have two children and make their home in North Florida.
